Thinning- feedback on the May 31-participation- Rich, Rick, Debbie, Kris, Lynsie, Sue It was confirmed that this is CORE responsibility for those that paid \$80 (pruning and thinning) We have **82** trees (includes 6 tour trees)that need thinning .Feedback was that apples mature at different rates depending on the variety ie Gravenstein and high density first, McIntosh, then Golden Delicious. It is faster and easier to thin when they are larger apples. It was decided to post a priority list for core and adopters to follow for pruning. It replaces pruning priority list. Hopefully, we can encourage adopters to help with a list with trees needing thinning. Thinning will develop larger apples which we can use for the upcoming cider squeeze. The McIntosh and Golden Delicious will not be ready till end of September.

**Mason Bees-**Rick- the bees are out of the orchard. THANK YOU for catching the problem with the construction of the coddling moth traps. The next spray should be the end of June.

**Insect trap update-Debbie** Section 1- 9 apple maggots 4 coddling moth; Section 2 -8 apple maggots 1 coddling moth Section 3- 8 maggots 2 coddling moth; section 4 -16 apples maggots 2 coddling moths.
